COOPER RIVER PARK

Cooper River Park is a 346 acre park that runs through Pennsauken, Cherry Hill, Collingswood and Haddon Township. The park is bounded by North and South Park Drives, Route 130 and Grove Street. The park was known as the Cooper Plantation and the river was a navigable waterway until its redesign and transformation under the Works Progress Administration in 1935 that

widened and straightened the river, and filled in marshy areas for recreational access.

Cooper River Park has hosted numerous major rowing events and is the ideal water venue, drawing praise from athletes and rowing experts for its 2,000 meter race course. The park is currently in the process of undergoing a transformation that will expand and redefine leisure. The revitalization will create a regional

hub for recreation by constructing a boardwalk and fishing piers along the riverbanks and improving athletic fields, picnic areas, the playground, and the park stadium.

The park's recreational facilities are popular year round, with visitors utilizing the sports fields and attending the many events. Visiting the park in the early morning can offer good wildlife viewing opportunities.
